




Here's What You Need to Know

The Senate has unveiled its new leadership team, promising a dynamic start to the upcoming session. Senate Democrats gathered in Savannah, GA on November 8 to determine their leadership for the session ahead, signaling a period of preparation and strategic planning. Meanwhile, Sen. Harold Jones from Augusta steps up as the minority leader, bringing his experience and vision to the forefront. Sen. Sonya Halpern has been named vice caucus chairman, tasked with fostering collaboration and strategy, and Sen. Jason Esteves will handle the crucial role of Vice Chair of Finance.

House Republicans are sticking with their seasoned leaders. Together with Speaker John Burns, Rep. Jan Jones (R-Milton) was once again nominated for another term as Pro Tempore, a role she's navigated since 2010. The GOP team is keeping its lineup strong with Rep. Chuck Efstration (R-Mulberry) back for a second term as House majority leader and Rep. James Burchett (R-Waycross) continuing as House majority whip. Rep. Bruce Williamson (R-Monroe) remains the majority caucus chair, while Rep. Houston Gaines (R-Athens) holds his position as majority caucus vice chair. Rounding out the leadership, Rep. Ginny Ehrhart (R-Powder Springs) continues as majority caucus secretary and treasurer.

On the other side of the aisle, Democrats are shaking things up with fresh faces in leadership. Rep. Carolyn Hugley (D-Columbus) steps up as Minority Leader, bringing new energy to the team. Rep. Tanya Miller (D-Atlanta), in her second term, is taking on the role of Chair. Spencer Frye joins the leadership as Vice Chair, promising a dynamic approach. Meanwhile, Rep. Sam Park (D-Lawrenceville) returns as House minority whip. Rep. Park Cannon (D-Atlanta) stays on as minority caucus secretary, and Rep. Solomon Adesanya (D-Marietta) continues as minority caucus treasurer.

Both parties are gearing up with their own strategies and leadership as they look ahead, each committed to advancing their agendas and making an impact.

eorgia's leaders are gearing up for a critical debate on tort reform, a hot topic that's been gaining traction in recent months. Furthermore, Insurance Commissioner John King has underlined the urgency of passing reform in the upcoming session. As these conversations evolve, it's clear that Georgia's political landscape is poised for significant debate and potential change in the realm of civil litigation.



Democrats have made Medicaid expansion a top priority, nearly securing enough support in the Senate, just missing one vote during the 2024 session. The newly elected Senate Minority Chair, Harold Jones, emphasizes the importance of addressing the needs of almost 290,000 individuals caught in a healthcare limbo—earning too much to qualify for Medicaid yet unable to afford private insurance. This topic remains a lightning rod for debate. Whether you're standing on the left or the right, there's no denying the urgency and complexity of finding a solution that works for everyone.
